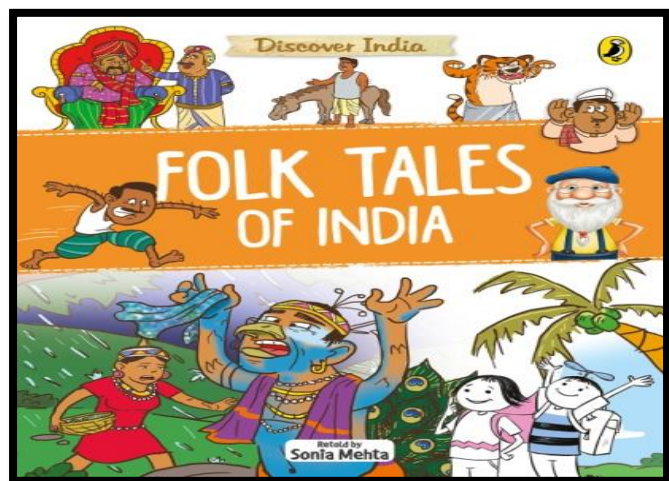
Activity 1: Reading Time!!

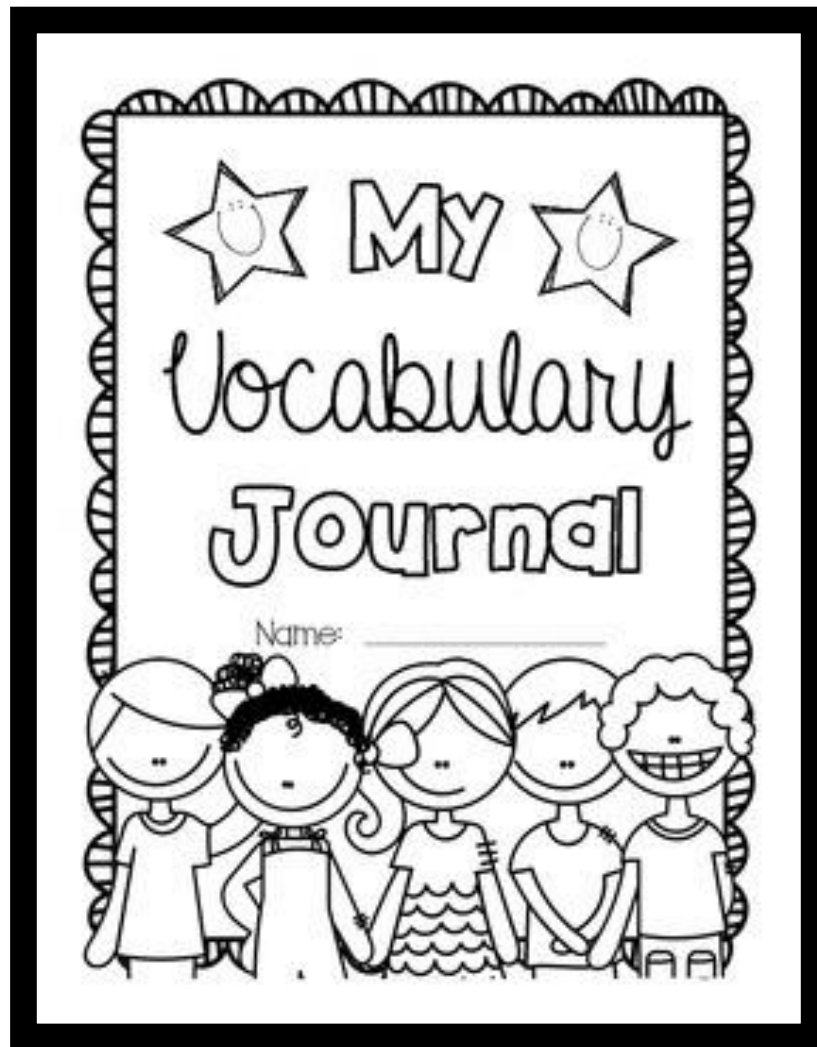

Take a chart paper and paste different frontline workers photos. Make a collage of it. Write 5 lines about your favourite frontline worker.

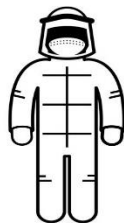

Activity 2: It's time to experiment

Gear up and get ready for some "Smart Summer Challenge".
Perform the listed below experiment, click pictures while doing it and send it to the teacher with your holiday homework.

Egg in Coke

Little kids love aerated drinks, and coke is a particular favourite. Use this science activity to teach them why coke is bad for them.

Materials needed: Two eggs, regular coke, water, two glasses

Instructions:

- 1. Explain to your kids that the shell of an egg is a lot like the enamel covering our teeth. Both are made of calcium carbonate and both are meant to protect what is inside it. The enamel protects the dentin that makes up most of the tooth.**
- 2. Ask your kids how teeth get spoiled. What kinds of foods are bad for teeth?**
- 3. Explain that you will be seeing how coke affects the enamel of teeth.**
- 4. Put one egg in the glass of water and one in the glass of coke.**
- 5. Leave the eggs overnight and return the next day to see what happened.**
- 6. Compare the two egg shells.**



Explanation:

Coke contains certain acids like citric acid and phosphoric acid which wear down hard substances like egg shells and enamel.

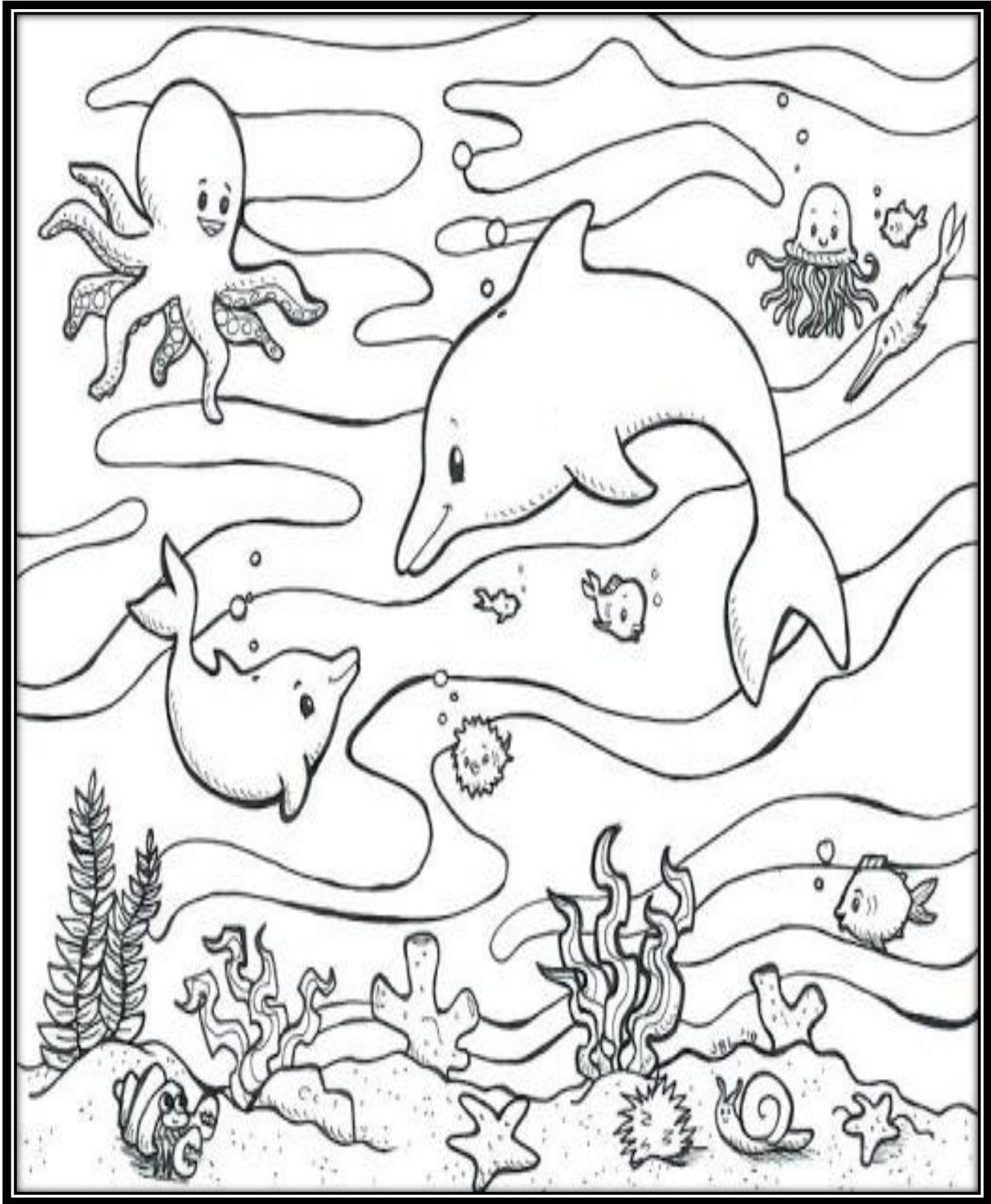
