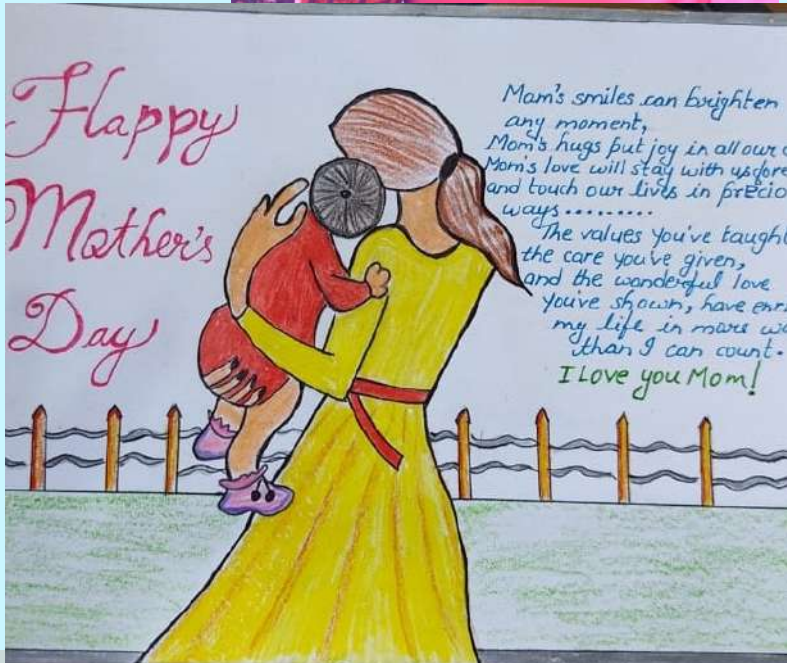
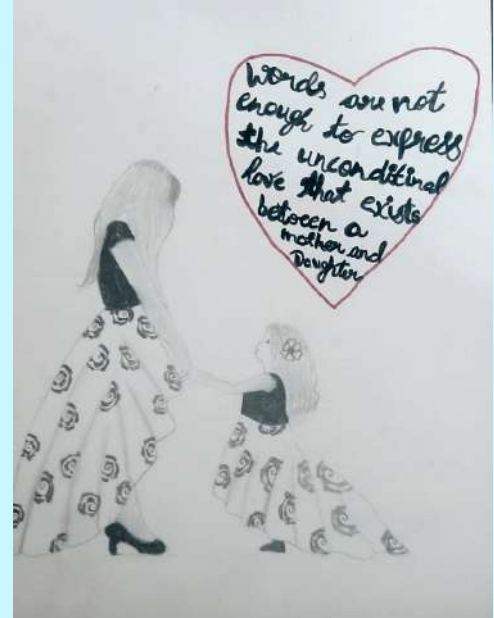
MOTHER'S DAY AND FATHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

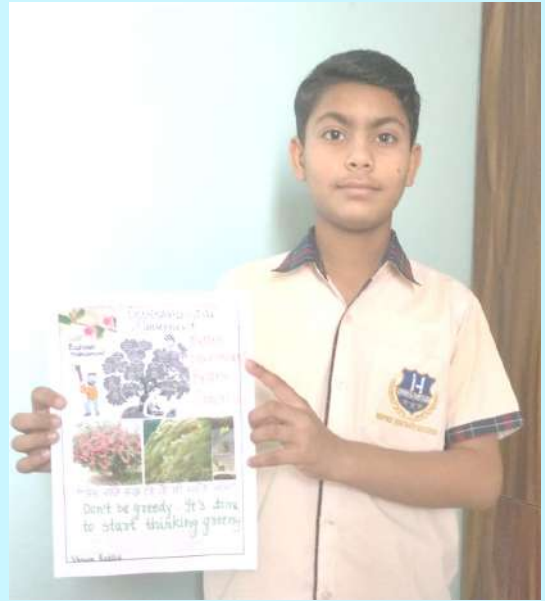
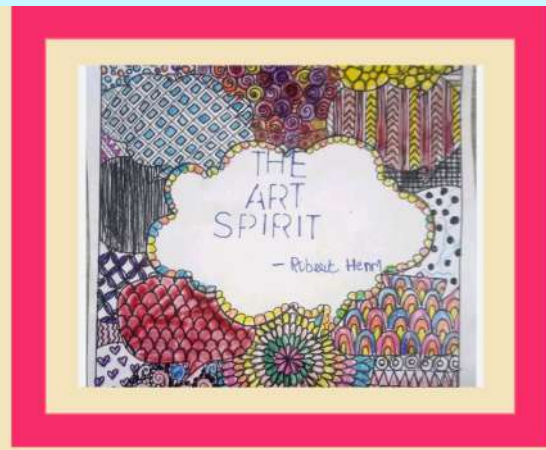
SPECIAL WEEKS

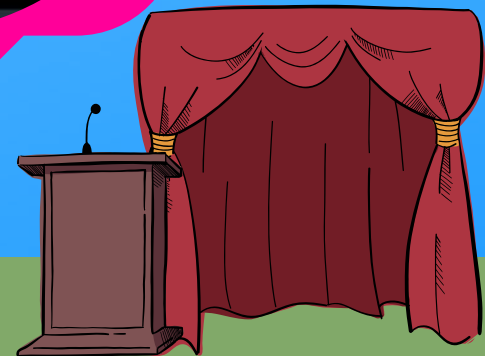
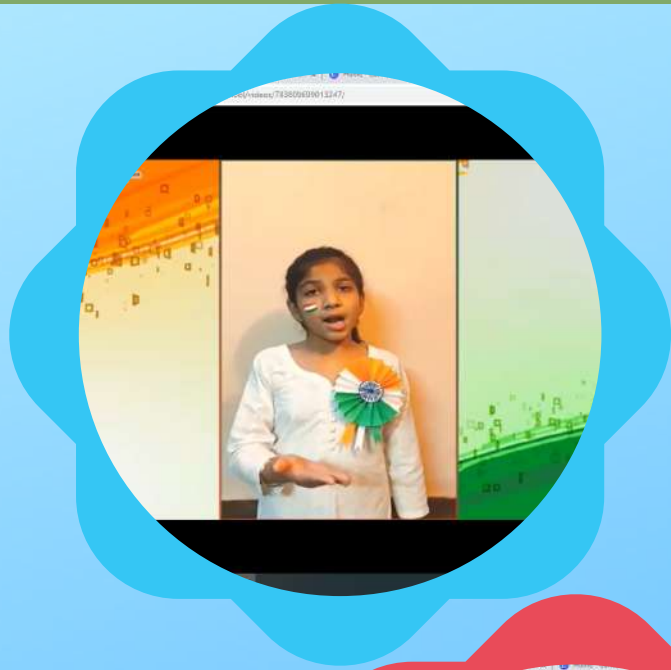






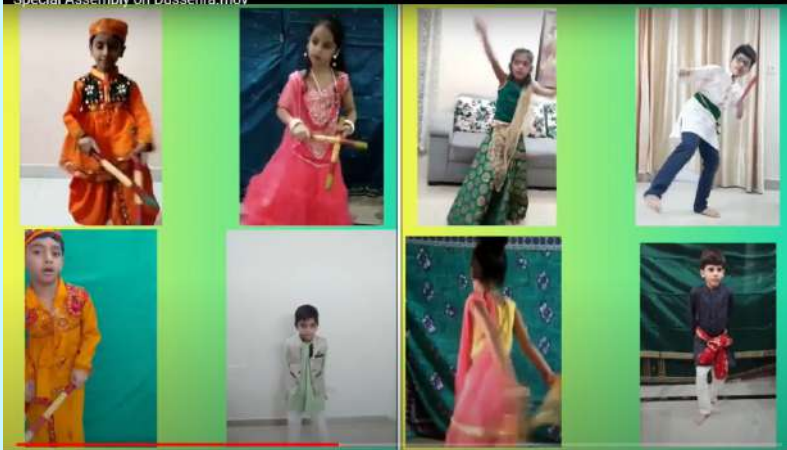
SPECIAL ASSEMBLIES

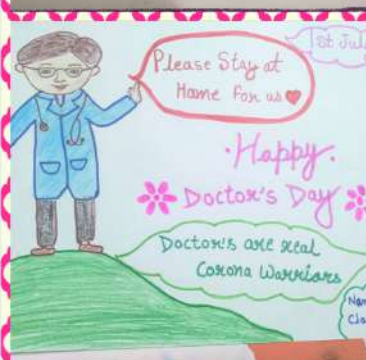
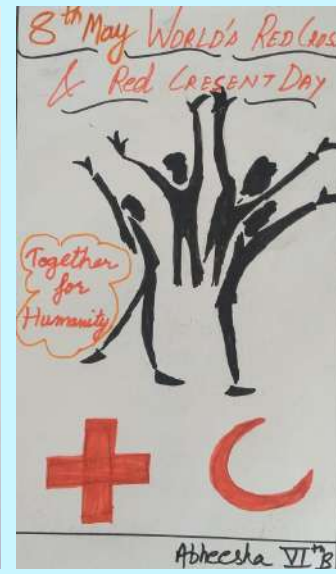


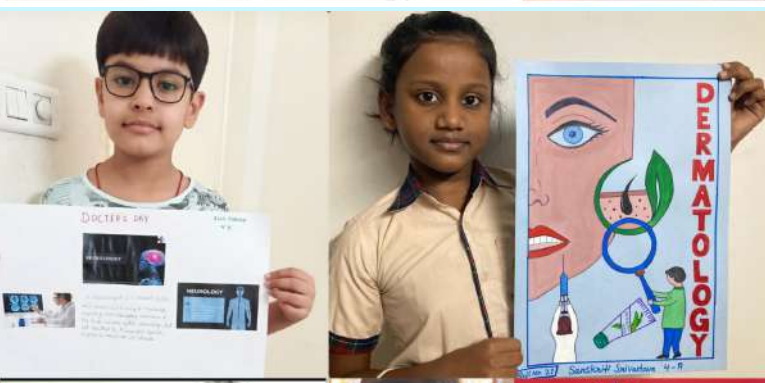
SPECIAL DAYS

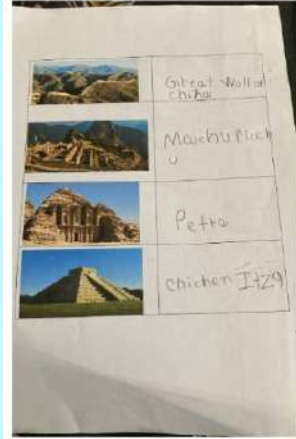

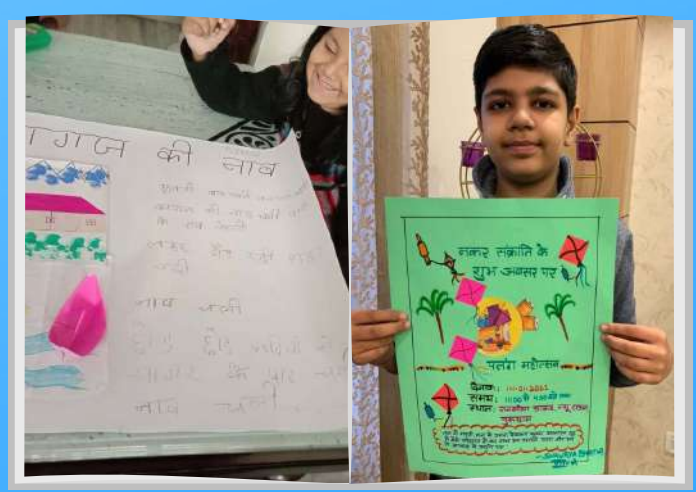

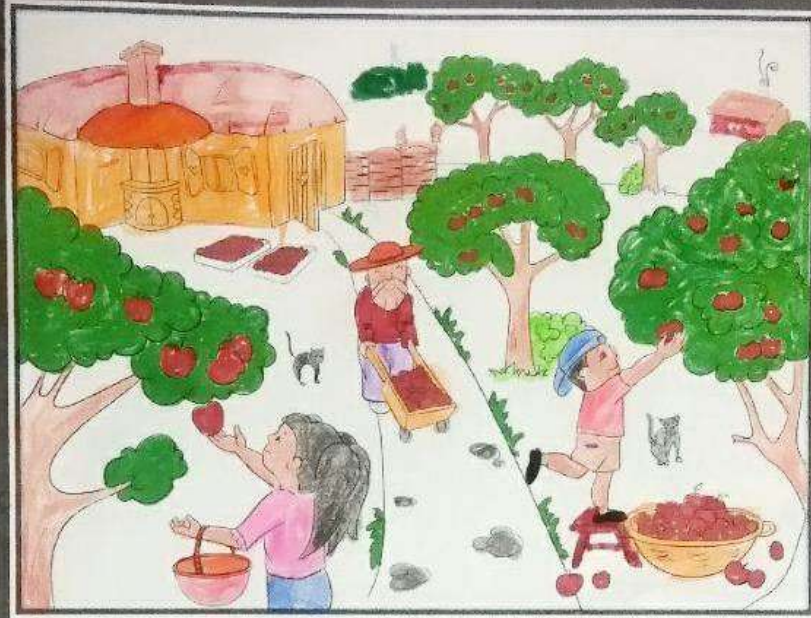
HINDI DIWAS

HINDI INTERSCHOOL COMPETITION

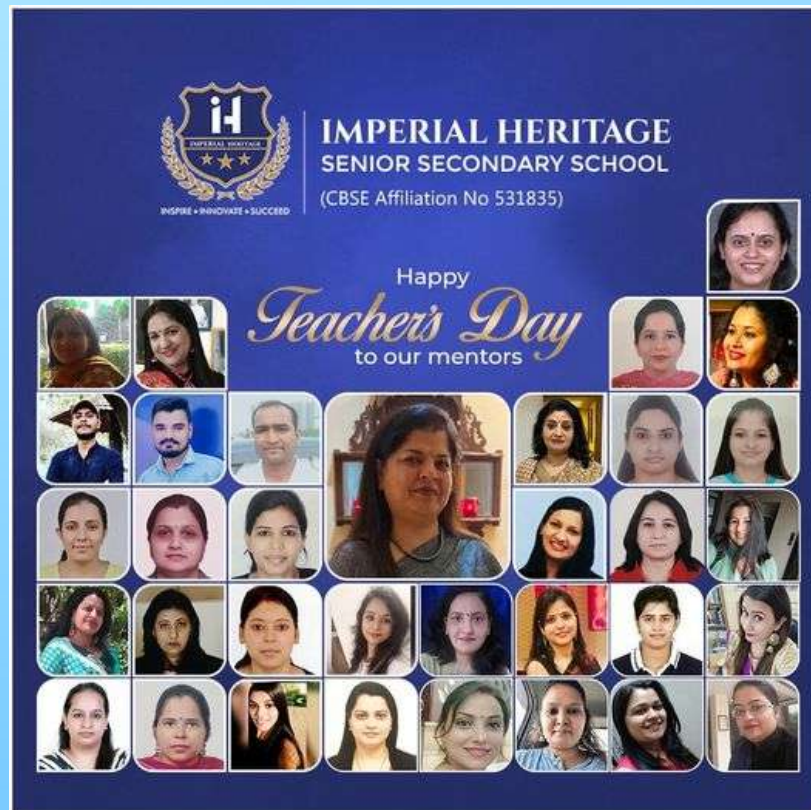

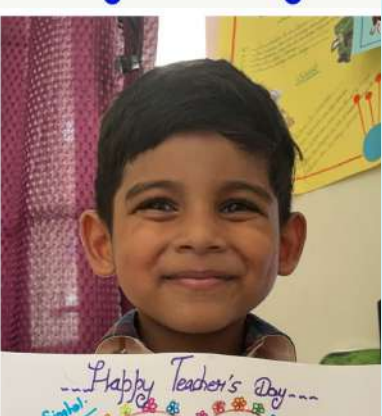
TEACHER'S DAY

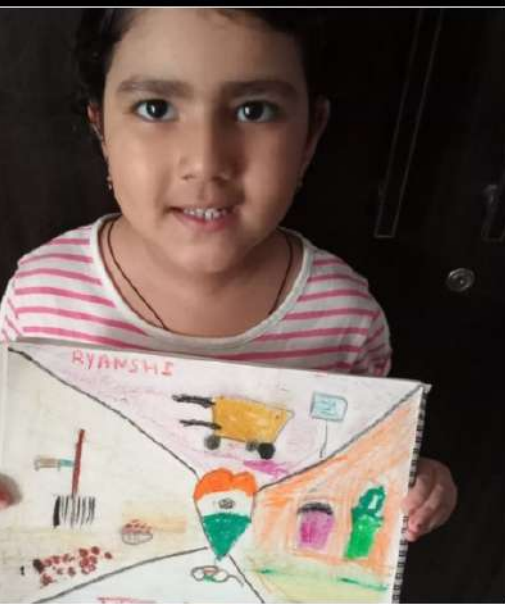
CBSE ACTIVITIES

Model United Nations, also known as Model UN, is an educational simulation and academic activity in which students can learn about diplomacy, international relations, and the United Nations. MUN involves and teaches participants research, speaking, debating, and writing skills, in addition to critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership abilities. It is meant to engage students and allow them to develop deeper understanding into current world issues. 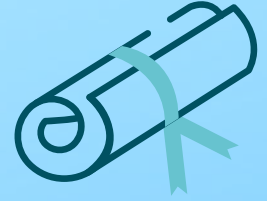

- AGI**-It's defined as AI which has a human-level of cognitive function, across a wide variety of domains such as language processing, image processing, computational functioning and reasoning and so on, sometimes referred to as "Strong AI"
- ASI**-Artificial Super Intelligence (ASI) system would be able to surpass all human capabilities. This would include decision making, taking rational decisions, and even includes things like making better art and building emotional relationships.

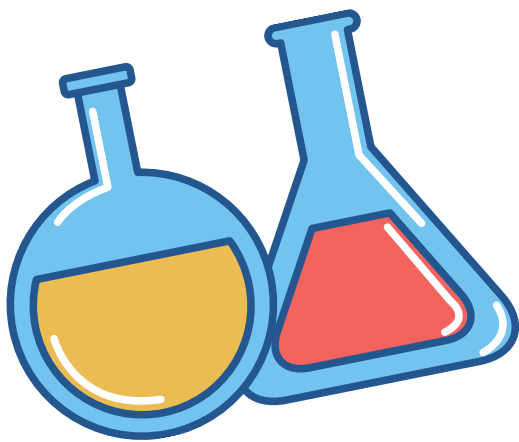
Since there is no specific medicine for this disease apart from vaccination, we urge to all to get the vaccinated as early as possible and practice the Covid-19 appropriate behaviour.
